Facility received a class 1 violation for failure to immediately report a release or threatened release of a hazardous material to the CUPA and CalOES. In addition, multiple class 2 violations were issued within the Hazardous Materials Business Plan (HMBP) and California Accidental Release Prevention Programs (CalARP). Class 2 violations included the facility's employee training plan, CERS reporting, risk management plan updates, and coordination with local emergency response agencies.
